

National Well-being Indicators - baseline ranking table @ January 2017

As part of the new [Well-being of Future Generations \(Wales\) Act 2015](#), Welsh Government have introduced a set of 46 [National Well-being Indicators](#) (see list below) to measure how we are achieving seven well-being goals (see below).

Welsh Government will publish a report on Wales's progress every year and their first report is due in 2018/19.

To see how Carmarthenshire is contributing to these National Well-being Indicators, we have produced a **Ranking table** which shows Carmarthenshire's most recent results compared to other Counties in Wales, and whether we have improved.

Guidance on the Ranking table:-

- The reference number in the first column refers to one of the National Well-being Indicators listed below.
For those Indicators where there's no data available currently or where data is only available at Wales level, this number is missing from the ranking table. Where the National Well-Being Indicator is supported by more than one sub-indicator the sub-indicator is shown as 2a, 2b, 2c etc.
- Year (s) – the top year is when the most recent data is available. The year in brackets is the previous period which is what the blue previous position boxes are based on.
- Results of all 22 Counties are ranked in numerical order of (left to right) worst to best and Carmarthenshire results are highlighted in either red, amber, yellow or green depending where we land numerically.
- The blue boxes show Carmarthenshire's position for the previous period
- A green arrow shows that the result has improved from its previous **position** (going left to right) – but this doesn't necessarily mean that the result itself has improved.
(e.g. no. 23 - % who feel able to influence decisions affecting their local area. has improved its position from 20th in 2013/14 to 9th position in 2014/15 but the result itself has fallen from 24.7% in 2013/14 to 21.3% in 2014/15% (see column on the right).
- A red arrow shows that the result has declined from its **position** (going right to left) – but this doesn't necessarily mean the result itself has declined.
(e.g. no. 5b 'Hooked on sport' has fallen from 10th position in 2013 to 16th position in 2015 but the result itself has improved from 40.3%(in lilac at the end column) in 2013 to 46.9% in 2015 (shown in orange).
- The last but one column on the right shows Carmarthenshire's result for the previous period and below this whether the current period has **improved, declined** or remained **constant** compared to the previous period.
- The lilac column on the right shows the Welsh average for the previous period (top) and current period (below).
