Overview

The World Health Organisation (WHO) Age Friendly Communities initiative aims to create environments that support healthy and active ageing. This involves making cities and communities more inclusive and accessible for older adults, ensuring that they can live safely, enjoy good health, and participate fully in society.

Key Features

- 1. **Global Network**: The WHO Global Network for Age-friendly Cities and Communities includes over 1,300 cities and communities in 44 countries. This network works to improve physical and social environments to become better places for people to grow old.
- 2. **Eight Domains**: The WHO Age-friendly Cities framework identifies eight essential features of age-friendly communities, known as the eight domains. These domains include outdoor spaces and buildings, transportation, housing, social participation, respect and social inclusion, civic participation and employment, communication and information, and community support and health services.
- 3. **Mentoring Programme**: The Age-friendly Environments Mentoring Programme provides guidance and support to develop skills needed to advance work on age-friendly environments.
